They brought our total for the 2013-2014 academic year to 14 graduates!


Mary Hayden Awarded NSF Fellowship

Dr. Chad Paton has joined ENTX as an assistant professor. Chad transferred from the College of Human Sciences at Texas Tech. His research interests are in human health and how excess nutrition, physical inactivity, and other environmental factors affect the regulation of metabolism, primarily through genetic mechanisms.



Dr. Céline Godard-Codding's laboratory is hosting Carlos Alberto López Montalvo, a doctoral student at Universidad Autónoma de Baja California Sur (UABCS), México. Carlos is pursuing a three-month internship in Céline's lab as part of an international collaboration on Gray whales.

Deer Research

In July, Texas Tech University officials celebrated a research investment totaling more than \$850,000 in support of a white-tailed deer and cervids research program at TIEHH. The new research program is led by Drs. Ernest Smith, Steve Presley, and Galen Austin. The research project is part of a collaboration between the university and the Deer Breeders Corporation, a group led by president Chris Timmons, a Texas Tech alum.




Alumni Spotlight
